The **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)** is a gradual process that takes place within the community of the faithful. It is a spiritual process of formation that focuses on faith development for those wishing to be baptized in the Catholic Church, or for baptized Christians who wish to be received into the Catholic Church, or for Catholics who are baptized but never received First Holy Communion or Confirmation. The RCIA meets individual needs which include religious education, prayer, worship, tradition, and scripture. It provides a means of renewal for all members of the community, since it reminds us of our own personal journey of faith.

The RCIA meets **Tuesdays in the church hall from 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm**. All are welcome! Please come and join us!
